Health and safety policy Nidd Valley Riding Club

- 1. The organiser NVRC has the overall responsibility for health and safety
- 2. The event/training is organised in accordance with health and safety legislation and all who have (to an extent) control of premises or site at the event are responsible for ensuring that:
- (A) Everything reasonably practicable is done to ensure the health and safety and welfare of those attending the event/training
- (B) They conduct themselves so that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk
- (C) Access to and egress from the site is safe
- (D) The effectiveness of the health and safety implemented for NVRC events/training are subject to regular review.

3. Emergencies

- (A) Emergency services must have access to all parts of the event site at all times and members of the public/ RC members/ competitors must not park vehicles so as to obstruct access.
- (B) In case of emergency, Members of the public/ RC members/ competitors should contact the nearest official or dial 999

4. Horses

Horses can easily be frightened and can be dangerous. Members of Public/ RC members/ competitors are requested to keep clear from horse areas/lanes and to avoid behaviour which might alarm horses. Dogs must be kept under close control and on leads.
